#### LIBRARY CHILD SAFETY POLICY

While all ages are welcome in the library, library staff is not responsible for unattended children. #### LIBRARY CARDS

Adults are asked to provide a current, government-issued photo ID and proof of residence at time of registration. Children may register for a library card at any age when they can accurately provide full name, address, phone number, and birthday. Parent or guardian permission must be provided for children who are unable to provide accurate registration information. Please see the Library Service Policy for more information.

#### PHOTOGRAPHY PERMISSION

The North Liberty Library may be taking photos at library sponsored programs for marketing purposes. Your participation in the program signifies your permission.
