#### **ACTIVITY IDEAS**

Practice rhyming words (cat, bat, mat, sat)

Make up a story with your child

Share a story from your childhood Play with water outside or in the sink

Sing ABCs Visit the library and check out a book

15-20 minutes of child lead playtime Ask your child questions (age, gender, birthday,

parents names or where they live)

Act out a fingerplay, such as "Itsy Bitsy Spider" Have your child "read" their favorite story to you
