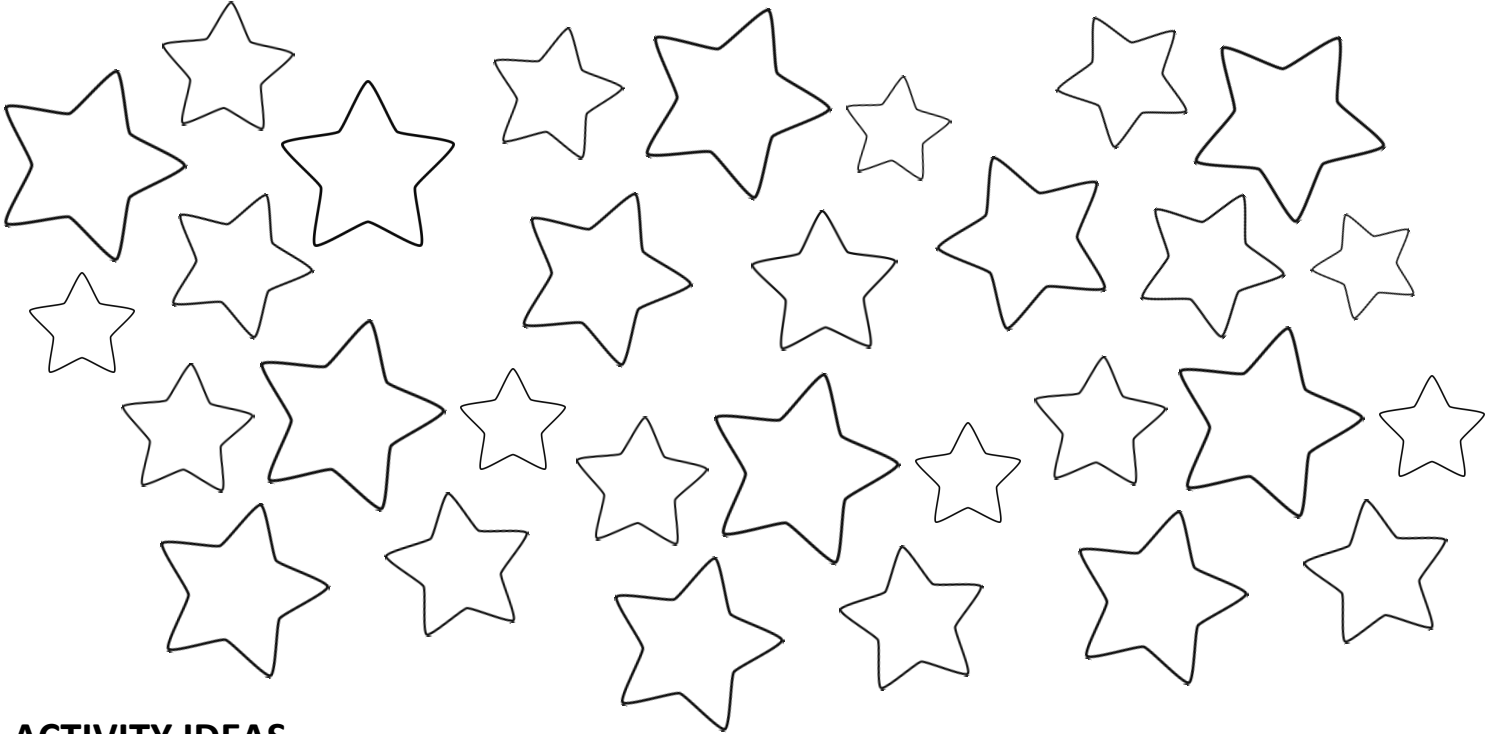
Family Reading Challenge

ACTIVITY IDEAS

15-20 minutes of child lead playtime

Share a story from your childhood

Use play dough and cookie cutters to make the ABCs

Learn the word for 'moon' or 'star' in a different language (ASL, Spanish, French, etc.)

Play a simple card game (match, slap number, go fish, old maid, etc.)

After reading a story ask your child questions about the book

Act out a fingerplay, such as "Five Little Monkeys Jumping on the Bed"

Spend 5 quiet minutes outside and talk about what sounds you hear and what things you see

Play an imaginary game of restaurant

Make up a story with your child

Play with water outside or in the sink

Visit the library and check out a Big Book Activity Kit

Ask your child questions (age, gender, birthday, parents names or where they live)

Have your child "read" their favorite story to you

Ask your child to assist with a household activity (fold laundry, set table, water plants)

Play I-Spy—with colors or items starting with different letters

Create a name puzzle and complete it

Practice writing their name with them

Turn in completed logs/activity logs by Wednesday, August 14 to ensure a prize.
